


NEW BOLLARDS SOUTH GREEN SHOPS

OVER THE last few years traffic has increased significantly outside the Tesco Express side of the shopping parade at South Green. Although there is a lay-by outside these shops drivers were mounting the pavement causing danger to pedestrians and blocking the pavement.

The Village Council worked with Essex County Council to resolve this dangerous parking. The bollards were installed this summer. They look attractive and have been effective in stopping the inconsiderate parking at that end of the parade of shops.



THE BIN outside Tesco Express was the most used at South Green. Although emptied regularly it was always overflowing. To tidy the area for residents the Village Council decided to install a solar powered bin which compacts waste. This enables the bin to collect five times the amount of waste before it needs emptying. Sensors automatically compact the waste when necessary and send an alert when the waste needs to be collected.

To ensure the bin would fit in with the surroundings the Village Council decided that it should carry images of the Village. As it is solar powered it is also economical to run. Residents have commented on the effectiveness of the bin as it has helped to stop the unsightly waste that accumulated.

DEFIBRILLATOR AT SOUTH GREEN SHOPS

THE VILLAGE Council has been working for nearly 2 years to have a defibrillator installed at South Green Parade of shops. The Village Clerk applied for a 50% grant for its funding and we matched the grant.

Retailers have been very helpful in trying to identify a suitable position at the shops. Jeremy of Tyler Estate Agents very kindly offered the front of his premises but installation advisers recommended the defibrillator should be located in the site lines of the CCTV for security reasons.

We then approached Belchers Butchers and Jennings & Curtis Greengrocers. Both retailers were happy for the equipment to be positioned between their stores but the final position was chosen nearer Belchers Butchers. We thank David of the butchers and Andy and Ben of the greengrocers and Day Lewis Pharmacy for their efforts to help residents with this vital piece of equipment.

It is now installed and will be a great safety addition for our Village.



BASILDON BOROUGH COUNCIL WASTE COLLECTION TEAM VISIT

AT THE September Village Council meeting Members were pleased to welcome two representatives from Basildon Borough Council Waste Collection team who shared information on the purpose of the public survey which was to be completed by 29 September and the possible changes that may be put in place.

We hope residents found the time to complete the survery on this important service. We thank the waste team representatives for attending our meeting and answering councillors' queries regarding the survey and waste collection in the district generally.

KENNEL LANE SITE ARCHAEOLOGICAL INVESTIGATION UNCOVERS ROMAN PAST

DESPITE THE Village Council and Basildon Borough Council strongly objecting to development on the Kennel Lane site outline planning has been granted to build 179 homes on land bounded by the A176 to the east and Kennel Lane to the north. The developers, Hill Partnership, were required to arrange a pre-construct Archaeological Investigation.

On 18 July councillors and interested residents were invited to visit the excavation and take part in an interactive archaeological experience. This proved to be an enlightening insight into the Roman history of the village. The Billericay School site, the Billericay School Farm site, (now Bell Hill Close) and the Kennel Lane site once formed part of a Roman settlement.

Professional archaeologists from the Cratus Group were on site explaining the process for excavating and determining the origins of the artefacts found. There were examples of: Roman pottery, coins, buttons, lead shot, part of a badge, a thimble, parts of amphora and Roman roof tiles. Other artefacts included animal bones, evidence of pottery kilns and ancient Roman drainage systems. If human remains were found the teeth would be forensically examined as strontium isotopes in teeth help determine the country of origin.

During Roman times wheat was grown in the area which was transported to Europe. Most recently the Kennel Lane site was farmed by a tenant farmer and the last crop was hay.

The site has been mapped using GPS and metal detectors have been run over the site. The investigation will not affect the planning process as the finds are not of historic significance but the site has been mapped for posterity.

The official Archaeological Report will take up to six months to complete as all the artefacts have to be analysed and recorded. It will then be published in the Essex Journal.



KING CHARLES III PORTRAIT & THANK YOU TO COUNCILLORS

THIS YEAR councils and other organisations were offered a free portrait of King Charles III to display. The Village Council were happy to accept the portrait and arrange for it to be installed and displayed at South Green Memorial Hall.

At the same time it was an opportunity to show our gratitude to two Village Councillors who have given long service to the council and worked on residents' behalf before stepping down. Bob Chapman and John Dear were thanked by all members for their many years of service.



PLANTING AROUND THE VILLAGE

THE VILLAGE Council has continued organising planting around the Village. At the bell bollards South Green, the notice board South Green and the Village Sign in Church Street, Great Burstead. Residents have commented how pleased they are with the displays. This year has seen a very wet spring and an exceptionally dry summer yet the displays have looked splendid.
